Town of Colchester Board of Finance Meeting Minutes May 6, 2020 – Virtual Meeting – 6:30 PM REGULAR MEETING of the BOARD OF FINANCE

1. CALL TO ORDER: Chairman Tarlov called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.

- 2. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA: B. Dennler motioned to add item 10b. Tax Abatement Committee, seconded by M. Egan. Vote was unanimous. MOTION CARRIED.
- 3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: April 8, 2020, Public Hearings on 4/15 and 4/16. Budget Workshops, 4/21, 4/23, 4/28 and 4/30: M. Hayes motioned to approve the meeting minutes as a block, seconded by M. Egan. Vote was unanimous. MOTION CARRIED.
- 4. CITIZEN COMMENTS: None
- CORRESPONDENCE: See attached.
- 6. DEPARTMENT REPORTS
 - a. Tax Collector
 - i. Report (April, if available): The April report will be given at the next regular meeting.
 - ii. Suspension List: M. Wyatt provided the Board with the Suspense List Recommendations which is a list of delinquent taxes that are uncollectible. A. Migliaccio motioned to accept the list designating each of the taxes contained on the list as uncollectible, seconded by M. Egan. Vote was unanimous. MOTION CARRIED.
 - b. Finance Department (March): M. Cosgrove provided the Board with an overview of revenue and expenditures through March 31, 2020, along with a general fund revenue comparison for fiscal year 19-20 to fiscal year 18-19. The tax collection rate was on track in March. It was a little lower for April this year than last year. There is still the potential to reach this year's collection rate goal but there is anticipation that it could be lower due to Covid. ECS funding is received with 25% coming at the end of October, 25% at the end of January, and the remaining 50% arriving at the end of April. There should be potential savings in snow removal.

- a. Transfer requests: None
- b. First Selectman's report: The Town has personnel working on preparing along with businesses for the opening of outside dining for restaurants as well as hair and nail salons. Matt Bordeaux, Town Planner, is the lead for the long-term recovery effort. Sean Shoemaker is working on establishing what will need to be done to open Town Hall and the library back up. The Bloom Energy project is ahead of schedule.

8. OLD BUSINESS: None

9. NEW BUSINESS

- a. 2020-2021 Budget: M. Egan requested at next Tuesday's meeting there be a discussion of Capital Reserve accounts and their balances.
- **b.** Tax Abatement Committee: A Tax Abatement Committee is being formed. The committee requires a representative from the Board of Finance. R. Tarlov motioned to appoint M. Hayes as the representative for the committee citing that he is the liaison to the Fire Department, seconded by A. Bibiskos. Vote was unanimous. **MOTION CARRIED.**
- 10. LIAISONS' REPORTS: A. Bibiskos reported that the Park and Rec Commission was not pleased with the \$35,000 for the fields being taken out of the First Selectman's budget. R. Tarlov said he shared an idea with First Selectman Bylone about a community match for fields; the Town would put in half the money needed if the sports leagues would match it as they have stated they are willing to help and have already contributed \$50,000, which is in the field sustainability fund. A. Migliaccio reported that the Police Commission is accepting applications for promotions to Corporal. R. Tarlov attended BOS meetings. BOS approved the tax deferral and low-interest rate package.

12. ADJOURNMENT: A. Bisbikos motioned to adjourn, seconded by M. Hayes. Vote was unanimous. **MOTION CARRIED.** Chairman Tarlov motioned to adjourn at 8:36 p.m.

I have voted Democratic most of my life, indeed, I worked last fall to get all the wonderful people elected to the Colchester town positions. I was in favor of all the great things proposed.

Subject: A word of caution

Rob,

My recollection is:

2007 the voter drove the 2007-2008 budget to a zero mill rate increase after a long and hard fought series of referendum. Interestingly enough even with a no tax increase, over \$500K went into the general fund. About half was revenue and half was spending. This was in spite of the tax collections estimate being under stated by \$243K.

In 2008, the FS decided to have a no tax increase budget. The proposed 2008-2009 budget passed with a zero mill rate increase. Unfortunately, that fiscal year was one of the few where money had to come back from the GFB to cover a \$200K short fall. Like always, the spending side was favorable to the tune of \$177K. The issue was the revenues being over estimated across the board. There was a \$373K short fall. I kept hearing rumors the First Selectman put pressure on the tax collector and department heads to make the revenue numbers as rosey as possible. The speculation was rosey revenue numbers avoided spending cuts. I have no proof beyond hearsay and that being one of the few years where revenue estimates were rosey as opposed to conservative.

I know the BoF has little say over the revenue numbers. I'd hate to think this year our First Selectman and our CFO would pressure our department heads and tax collector to offer rosey numbers and use the GFB to cover shortfalls later. Not saying it is happening just offering taking into consideration the possibility when deciding on approving spending for the next fiscal year.

It is my understanding that BOF does not get involved in the operations, only the annual budget process. I am under the impression that only the current contracts are posted. I will check on that as well. There are disadvantages to being newly elected...and some advantages. I plan to have a very detailed transition to the person who follows me, most of it in writing. We are missing some infrastructure that really would have helped around processes and practice. But we will get there. I have been keeping notes...
