Regular Meeting Wednesday, September 8, 2021 Town Hall, 127 Norwich Avenue Minutes of Meeting

CALL REGULAR MEETING TO ORDER

Chairman von Plachecki called the Regular Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

- C. <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> August 11, 2021

Motion made by M. Rogers to approve the minutes of August 11, 2021. Motion was seconde $\frac{2}{4}$ by $\frac{2}{5}$. Bruening. Motion carried; Rebecca Meyer abstained.

- F. NEW APPLICATIONS -
 - A. <u>W2021-3066</u> Modification of permit <u>#W2021-3064</u>- Resubdivision, Cabin Road, Proposed sewer connection.

Jay Gigliotti reported on the modification of W2021-3064 first stating the lots were approved in July on septic systems, however, due to an issue with a zoning regulation, the plan needs to be changed to connect the new lots to the public water and sewer. To complete this, it is proposed to install a sewer line that would traverse the open space and go under the brook to a manhole at an existing sewer line. The proposal is not to physically cross the brook, but to directionally bore from one manhole through the sewer easement, under the brook, and out another manhole. A schematic was shown for the commissions review.

MINUTES Wednesday, September 8, 2021 Colchester Conservation Commission John Doran, applicant, noted the boring occurs with a set up outside the wetlands, near Jordan Lane, and it is a directional boring, 54" deep, and continues through the easement. Water is used in the process, boring through the earth, using (2) 3" schedule 80 force main pipes taking approximately 4 days to complete. A primary and secondary reserve pipe will be installed. Jay Gigliotti stated a favorable review has been received from Sal Tassone, Town Engineer. Rebecca Myer asked how remediation would occur if there is a break of the pipe in the open space area, and questioned if it is water that is used to force the piping through. John Doran stated water is used to assist the drilling. The piping is schedule 80, therefore a break or a mishap are slim to none. There is a backup generator that will be installed along with an alarm system if there is a fault. Should the primary force main fail, sewage will automatically be switched to the seconded force main.

Motion made by M. Rogers to approve modification of permit <u>#W2021-3064</u>- Resubdivision, Cabin Road, Proposed sewer connection. Motion was seconded by R. Meyer. Motion carried
