- 1. Call To Order Chairman Goldstein called the meeting to order at 6:32 p.m.
- 2. Public Comments There were no public comments.
- 3. Changes or Additions to Agenda There were no changes to the Agenda.

4. Approval of Minutes

a. July 20, 2020 – Mrs. Perham moved to approve the minutes. Mr. Hinchliffe seconded the motion. Mrs. Perham requested her first name be spelled correctly. The minutes were approved unanimously.

5. New Business

a. Town Planner Report

Mr. Bordeaux stated that a local restaurant owner was working with the Colchester Business Association to promote a "Restaurant Week" beginning December 5th. Mr. Bordeaux indicated that Sara Bronin would be joining the Planning and Zoning Commission to discuss affordable housing at the November 18, 2020 regular meeting. He also described a few potential development projects including a medical marijuana production facility, an affordable housing development and a distribution facility. The Commission questioned the status of recent zoning regulation amendments and the NCT Friction Welding special permit application.

b. 2021 Meeting Calendar Review and Possible Adoption

Mr. Faski moved to adopt the 2021 meeting schedule as proposed. Mrs. Perham seconded the motion and all members voted in favor.

- c. Review and Possible Amendments to C-TIP Application and Scoring Sheet

 Chairman Goldstein discussed the idea of reviewing the C-TIP application eligibility along with the review process to consider non-traditional forms of economic development. He indicated that applicant's representing non-traditional commercial projects should be allowed to make a case for the need for a tax abatement and the value of a particular project to the Town. Mr. Bordeaux made a few suggestions for edits to the application documents including a reference to the Town's Plan of Conservation and Development to ensure a project is consistent with the goals and objectives of that plan. Mr. Bordeaux proposed preparing edits he thinks are appropriate and providing a draft for the Commission's review and consideration at the next regular meeting.

- 7. Adjourn Mr. Faski moved to adjourn the meeting. Mr. Suarez seconded the motion and all members voted in favor. The meeting was adjourned at 7:24 p.m.
