Many of our wonderful instructors have been working hard to transition their classes into virtual and remote programs. They are ready to bring these classes to you and they really miss their time with you each week! We hope that you will register for the classes that you have come to love and spend some time catching up with friends and instructors while we keep each other in good company.

## **Current closures and cancellations:**

- -Per the State of CT and local mandates, the playground, tennis courts, basketball courts, pavilion and the skate park are closed. The fields are closed to all group gatherings and use.
- -All permits that were issued for the RecPlex fields and pavilion, the Town Green and Ruby Cohen have been cancelled through the end of May 2020.
- -The Airline Trail spur between Lebanon Ave. and Old Amston Rd. is closed through May for the installation of the natural gas line and the Bloom Energy Project.
- -All events through the end of May including the Bark in the Park, Car Show on the Town Green, Lions Club Carnival and the Memorial Day Parade have been cancelled.

## **SUMMER DAY CAMP INFORMATION**

Our Summer Day Camp will be held...but it will be like no other camp you have attended before! The creativity and the inspiration that you will find will knock your socks off!

We are closely monitoring all local, state, and federal mandates- and we will follow each one. This means that camp information might change weekly based on the mandates. We are adapting and growing every day to keep our campers and staff safe and engaged all summer. Please check the website frequently for updates.

Camp will be held Mondays- Fridays, June 29-August 22, 2020 from 7:45 am- 4:00 pm. The cost has been lowered to \$150 per week, per child to assist all families during this difficult time.

Our goal is to provide a safe and healthy camp for our staff and campers. We understand that camp is considered an essential service and many parents may need to send their child to camp to return to work. We take this responsibility very seriously and we are working hard to put every safety measure in place.

### Let's paint a picture of our new 2020 day camp.....

Spread out over acres of the RecPlex, you will see pop up tents to provide shaded areas with tables and chairs. Each tent will become home base to a group of campers and their staff. These tables and chairs will be easily disinfected throughout the day (unlike wooden picnic tables), there will be hand sanitizer on the tables and frequent trips to the rest room to wash hands with soap and water.

Staff will be wearing face coverings, but the campers are not required to wear them. If you feel more comfortable- we will assist your child with wearing their own face mask, as we do with applying spray- on sunscreen.

Campers will be grouped based on their interest, rather than their ages, although wide age ranges will be avoided. Since each group will remain together for the week and will not interact with other groups, this will ensure that they can do more activities that are of interest to them. In many cases, siblings will be grouped together as well.

We will not be going on any field trips this summer because they are not allowed by the State of Ct. However, this opens up some time for small group activities that are difficult to do in a large group like....trivia contests, learning magic tricks, hands on STEAM projects, chapter books, friendship bracelets, field games, obstacle courses, bike rodeos, artwork and more. The small groups will not be the same camp experience as in past years...but I am excited to see the way the friendships grow in a small group that has time to work and build together!

The camp staff will be creating projects to keep our campers busy all summer.... projects that will limit high touch items, shared supplies, and cross contamination. We will be posting our list of needs on Facebook and the website- if you can help, we would really appreciate your support! These donations will help keep the staff and campers happily engaged and safely separate.

Our sign in procedures will be quite different. Parents will remain in their cars and line up. Our camp directors will approach each car and ask the parent to take the campers temperature with our thermometer. If the child does not have a fever of 100 or higher, the parent will be asked a few more questions about other symptoms common in children. If these are not present, the child will get out of the car and will be helped to their group. We will need your patience with this procedure, we will do our absolute best to keep the line moving, but we are mandated to implement these procedures for the health and safety of everyone at camp. Our staff will be screened as they arrive to work daily and will not attend work if they have a temperature or any symptoms.

Throughout the day, our staff and the Parks staff will be sanitizing and disinfecting all areas of the park that we will be using- including the tables, chairs and the bathrooms.

We have cancelled extended care. Unfortunately, our staff cannot work longer than 40 hours per week. We cannot combine the groups at the end of the day into an "extended care group," and we cannot bring in new staff to cover for the day staff.

You might wonder what happens if a staff member or a camper develop the COVID-19 virus. While we are going to do everything possible to prevent this from happening, we understand that there are risks involved in being together. We also understand that camp is an essential program as many parents will need to return to work. If anyone becomes sick or tests positive, we have specific guidelines to follow. These include contact tracing and asking the exposed group to self-quarantine for 2 weeks.

## **IMPORTANT REMINDERS:**

- Registration closes one week before the week you are registering for (example- if you are signing up for the week of June 29th, registration closes June 22nd).
- Health Forms- If we have a health form on file from previous years, we do not need an updated form until your doctor's office reopens. If we do not have a health form on file, we will need a physical form. Please call the office to discuss with our staff.
- If your child is coming to camp and has a medical condition, is immunocompromised, or will need special consideration when being placed in a group, please call the office to discuss with our staff.
- There is no extended care from 4-6pm.
- There will be no preschool camp this summer
- There will be no option for 6/7 graders to attend 3 days a week this summer.
- All of our camp staff are returning staff- so they have extensive knowledge and experience working with children. Our camp training has started, and will be a combination of Zoom conference calls, online classes and webinars.

## **ONLINE VIDEOS**

### **Garden and Grow**

Twice a week, Peggy Wagner takes us on a journey through the spring planting season! You will learn something new in each video about how to grow your own garden- from the preparation, to the seeds, to harvesting your crop!

### **Random Acts of Science**

Twice a week, Lindsay Floyd and her daughter Coral post a new video on our Facebook page that explores a new science experiment. They will demonstrate the experiment, explain how it works and what the science is behind the demonstration. All of the experiments use simple, household items that you can find in your homes and you can try with your family!

## **ONLINE PROGRAMS**

Many of our program instructors have put a lot of time and energy into learning new ways to teach - we are so thankful for their dedication and hard work to our community. They made the decision to move their class to a virtual or remote classroom. They have made this decision based on what works best for their class and their teaching style. There are several options, and Colchester Recreation is exploring all ideas and remote learning tools. We will continue to research and learn to find what works best for our instructors and our community. But...we still miss all of our participants and can't wait to see everyone in person some day! As we move forward, we expect that the "new normal" might very well include some form of virtual or video access to programs. Serving our community includes those without access to attending class- this has provided a new perspective. Our goals for the future include a broader view of community access and programming.
