TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Bus Transportation is available for seniors living in We provide transportation services Monday through Friday to and from the Colchester Senior Center, local and out-of-town medical appointments (within а 40-mile radius Colchester), grocery shopping, shopping trips and other local outings, as advertised in the newsletter.

We offer curb-to-curb drop off, except for some communities where there is a designated pickup/drop-off area. We are not able to bring people into their homes, doctor's office. stores or restaurants. Once dropped off, all riders must be able to get to their destination independently or must ride with a companion who is able to safely assist them.

In order to best serve you, we require that in-town transportation reservations are made BY 12:00 p.m. THE DAY BEFORE. Please call to make out-oftown medical transportation arrangements as soon as you know the date of your appointment. All rides are on a first come-first served basis. We do not charge for bus transportation. Donations to help defray the cost of gas and vehicle maintenance are greatly appreciated and may be made in the Colchester Senior Center office.

HOME HEATING SAFETY

The fall season is heating appliance tune-up time. Have all fuel-burning, heating appliances services and your chimney checked. Remember to keep all combustibles away from all heating appliances.

Never use your stovetop or oven as a heating source. This is highly dangerous and can lead to home fire. Home heating assistance is available for income-qualified households. You may contact the senior center for more information.

Kerosene heaters can be dangerous when operated in enclosed spaces. Always use proper ventilation. Only fill the tank with more kerosene when the heater is off and cool. Note: The State of Connecticut Fire Code prohibits the use of kerosene heaters in multiple family dwellings.

A person's risk for carbon monoxide poisoning can increase during home heating season. Though CO is odorless, colorless and tasteless, a malfunctioning heating appliance may emit an odor similar to vehicle exhaust. This is a clue that improper combustion is taking place and will continue to get worse if not corrected. Sometimes exposure to carbon monoxide (CO) can be confused with flu symptoms, food poisoning or other Symptoms may include illnesses. shortness of breath. nausea. dizziness/light-headedness or headaches. High levels of CO can be fatal. causing death within Install CO and Smoke minutes. Detectors and change the batteries annually.
