Additionally, adults have training expenses such as CPR certifications for the safety of all scouts. During the pandemic, fundraising has been virtually impossible, particularly considering the population we serve. Costs that have typically been covered by fundraising have had to be placed on the families who face their own personal challenges due to the pandemic, financial and otherwise. Sustaining membership in scouting during the pandemic has been a challenge.					
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Briefly explain the positive impact your project will have on the community.

Our Troop participates in town wide community service such as the Scouting-for-Food initiative and projects benefiting the Colchester Garden Club. Eagle Scout candidates from our Troop have provided many community service projects for groups such as the CBA (welcome sign installation), CHFD (picnic tables and flag poles), WJJMS (benches and picnic tables), The Colchester Land Trust (Trail head sign), Colchester Parks and Rec (Benches), and the Colchester Preschool CO-OP (tables and sign), just to mention the most recent. The community benefits from the opportunity for positive engagement that Scouts provides. Few youth programs directly benefit the community in the way that Scouting does. Scouting helps youth develop academic skills, self-confidence, ethics, leadership skills, and citizenship skills. Scouting goes beyond many programs that teach basic skills and promote teamwork and encourages youth to achieve a deeper appreciation for service to others in their community.

Describe the impact to your department / business / establishment if ARPA funds are NOT approved.

Without the equipment needed to provide scout programming, the future of the Troop will be in jeopardy. Interest in scouting has unfortunately wained as youth have an ever-increasing number of pastimes to choose from, Colchester has already lost one of three Packs in town and a second is struggling to maintain work-able numbers. Without healthy Packs which provide most membership for the three Troops in town, the health of the Troops is also in jeopardy. Without fun and engaging camping and trips to offer, membership is likely to continue to dwindle. Time spent fundraising to overcome the gaps created by the pandemic is time that boys are not participating in programming, taking away from the quality of the program and making retention even harder.
