- 1. Call to Order The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.
- 2. Additions to Agenda There were no additions to the Agenda
- 3. Minutes of Previously Held Meeting: October 19, 2020 (Special Meeting)
  - Mr. Kverderas moved to approve the meeting minutes of October 19, 2020. Ms. Akerman seconded the motion. Ms. Akerman noted her name was misspelled under item #10. The minutes were approved unanimously.
- 4. Five Minute Session for Public: Ms. Sharon asked Mr. Bordeaux to provide an overview of the new application for improvements on the Town Green so that the public would have an opportunity to comment since the Agenda did not include the item listed as a public hearing.

Mr. Bordeaux described the project, the grant program, process and proposed improvements. The improvements consist of the improvement of the main path and in the installation of ancillary paths; the erection of a new bus shelter; the installation of lights, benches and trash receptacles; the replacement of the community events board; and the replacement of electrical utility shed located adjacent the gazebo. Mr. Bordeaux requested that improvements of the gazebo be considered as a follow-up to the current proposal.

Ms. Sharon opened the meeting to the public and requested that comments be directed toward each improvement in sequence. Public comments included an emphasis on the importance of regular maintenance, the poor condition of the main path; the possibility of reducing the number of benches. Mr. Andrew Norton conveyed the opinion of the Bacon Academy Board of Trustees. Mr. Greg Barden expressed the importance of the electrical outlets proposed to be installed in the base of the light posts to the various user groups and event participants on the Green throughout the year.

The Commission also reviewed and commented on each proposed improvement in sequence. There was general favor for the proposed 4-sided light, renovation of the main path, and bus shelter. The Commission was generally opposed to the proposal for the new connecting path to Hayward Avenue as it would interrupt the green space between the ball field and the gazebo. The Commission requested additional information for the next meeting.

**Application for Certificate of Appropriateness** 

Address of Proposed Work: Town Green

Owner: Trustees + Proprietors of Bacon Academy / Town of Colchester

General Description of Proposed Work:

On January 18, 2019, the Town of Colchester was awarded a \$397,000 grant under the Community Connectivity Grant Program by the State Department of Transportation. The program initiative is to improve accommodations for bicyclists and pedestrians in community centers. These community centers serve as a place where people can meet for social, educational, employment and recreational activities. The goal of the Program is to make conditions safer and more accommodating for pedestrians and cyclists, thereby encouraging more people to use these healthy and environmentally sustainable modes of travel.

The project consists of the improvement of the main path and associated enhancements such as new, pedestrian-scale lighting running parallel to the main path, new park benches, trash receptacles, a new bus shelter and new paths to provide key connections within the park.

The main path will be reconditioned for a uniform width and graded to drain appropriately. This means that the surface material will be stripped and reused, or a new stone dust will be spread and rolled into an improved subbase of processed gravel. Either way, the result is intended to mimic the existing condition. The improved subbase will be installed to an engineered standard (depth and composition) intended to handle the volume and type of traffic seen throughout the year. The edges will be restored with topsoil and grass seed and graded to blend naturally into the existing turf.

To improve circulation on the Green, particularly during events that permit or necessitate vehicle traffic within the park, a new section of path, of the same material and dimension as the existing main path, is proposed to make a connection from the main path to Hayward Avenue. This will accommodate a one-way circulation of vehicle traffic and reduce the uncertainty of where vehicles may be traveling while pedestrians are present. The location of the proposed "new" connection is depicted on the site plan in the vicinity of an historic path that once crossed the park from east (Hayward Avenue) to west (Main Street).

The new light posts will line both sides of the main path and be staggered at a uniform distance for a formal, intentional look. Associated with each new light post, a park bench will be set off approximately four (4) feet from the path. Each bench would be mounted to an appropriate footing set just below grade and the ground surface treated to be consistent with the main path. New trash receptacles will replace the existing barrels and be distributed, as appropriate, across the Green.

A new bus shelter is proposed to replace the one destroyed in an automobile accident (see "Proposed Bus Shelter and Information Kiosk" prepared by William Brewster Architects, attached). The attached rendering is intended to depict the form only. The new shelter will be framed with wood (not PVC or aluminum as noted), either pressure-treated or a species resilient to outdoor exposure such as cedar or cypress. The majority of the wall space will be glass to allow natural light to enter, providing 360-degree

visibility for safety and security reasons. The roof will include a bell-shaped design, taking cues from the existing gazebo on the Green, and be completed with architectural asphalt shingles.

As depicted on the site plan prepared by Anchor Engineering Services, the bus shelter will be shifted from its current position to better line up with the existing pull-off on Main Street intended to allow the CT Transit commuter bus to move safely out of the lane of traffic. A pedestrian path will be constructed from the existing, signalized crosswalk on Main Street to the bus shelter, with a short stem connection to the Main Path. These proposed ancillary connections will be approximately six (6) feet wide and of the same material as the main path.

Additional improvements will include the replacement, in kind, of the Colchester Community Events board located at the corner of Norwich Avenue and Main Street. The electrical utility shed and the telephone pole it is mounted to, located in the vicinity of the gazebo, will be removed. The electrical connections and meter box will be relocated in a marine-rated closet installed in the landscape bed surrounding the gazebo. In this position, the box would not really be below ground but rather in the well-drained landscaping soil, surrounded by landscaping, essentially screened from public view.

#### **Activities to be funded by Community Connectivity grant**

- Renovation and installation of pedestrian paths through the Town Green as depicted on the site
  plan prepared by Anchor Engineering Services. The subsurface will be improved with a
  processed gravel and graded to drain. The surface will be finished with a stone dust / crushed
  granite to match the material currently in place.
- Twelve (12) new, period-appropriate, re-creation, 12-14' post-mounted lights with electrical outlets






