6. Project Manager update and potential action:

- T. Hamelin gave the monthly report for March, including the Project Budget Summary. Total changes with CM Contingency is .59% or \$216,431.32.
- Cx & Punch list items are 95% complete. Additional items will be worked on next week during the school break.
- Red Thread will be doing the rewiring for TouchIt boards next week.
- Study carrels are coming apart and the hydraulics on the science lab stools have been malfunctioning. T. Hamelin is working with the manufacturers to correct faulty equipment.
- Casters for desk and chairs have been ordered but there has been no delivery date as of yet. The hope had been to do the replacements during the break.
- The irrigation system is scheduled to go in soon.
- Rollerblades were damaged during the move due to improper storage. The school would like all of them to be replaced. Chairman Tyler questioned if that should be part of the building project.
- J. Butkus said Arcadis is nearing the end of their services. He will have a formal proposal for the next meeting on the continuation of services.
- 7. Architect update and potential action: S. Melingonis had nothing new to report.

8. Construction Manager update and potential action:

- G. Kotait distributed O&G Monthly Progress Report No. 24 through March 2019.
- Summary Data and GMP allowances were reviewed.
- Sitework to complete the fields will begin in April.
- Mechanical Units roof screens will be replaced starting Saturday.
- Status of Project Closeout Log requirements for contractor retainage reduction and release were reviewed.
- CES parking driveway will start being restored in the next couple weeks.
- DOA Unity pre-filters and heat recovery wheel damage issue with Daikin has not yet been resolved.
- Revisions for dumpster pad are moving forward.
- A. Tarnowski motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #195 for a total net sum of \$3,804, seconded by L. Goodwin. All members voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
- I. Malsbenden motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #196 for a total net sum of -\$9,267, seconded by L. Goodwin. All members voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
- J. Ruiz motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #197 for a total net sum of \$6,926, seconded by L. Goodwin. All members voted in favor. MOTION CARRIED.
- I. Malsbenden motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #198 for a total net sum of \$12,982, seconded by L. Goodwin All members voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
- I. Malsbenden motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #199 for a total net sum of \$10,963 seconded by L. Goodwin All members voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.**
- A. Tarnowski motioned to approve Out of Scope Change #200 for a total net sum of \$51,106, seconded by J. Ruiz. All members voted in favor. **MOTION CARRIED.** P. Picard requested it is noted that the dumpster area should have been designed correctly, to begin with.

Tecton was asked to look at the current layout of the fields to see if adding a baseball field is possible and what the cost would be.
