All Souls Day

Is celebrated on November 2nd in commemoration of the faithfully departed and is observed primarily in the Catholic Church. Its origins date back to European folklore related to customs of veneration practiced worldwide through events like the Mexican Day of the Dead (Dia de los Muertos) or the Chinese Ghost Festival. To remember their departed loved ones, many cultures prepare meals for the souls of the dead, and light candles or leave flowers on relatives graves.
